Subject :MASTER OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE

a) Mission, Objectives and Relevance of the Programme:

The objective of the Masters programme in Library& Information Science is to impart knowledge to the aspirant students about various theoretical and practical dimensions of the subject. As a discipline, it has its roots in all the aspects of society as well as it has relation with other subjects covered in Social Science. Knowledge ofLibrary& Information Science prepares the learners to develop such skills that prepare them to participate in the process of policy formulation at micro and macro levels. - Students after completing post-graduation in Library & Information Sciencecan pursue research.
- After qualifying UGC/NET examination, students can take up teaching as profession in colleges and universities.
- Students can work as Lirbrary Restorers in Sr. Sec. Schools.

- Personal Contract Programmes (PCPs) are held for 10-12 days during each semester. In addition to the formal lectures, consultation is provided to the learners during the PCPs.
- Print/Online lessons are provided to the learners. Along with English medium Learning material is also made available in the vernacular (Punjabi, in our case).
- Faculty is available in accordance to the prescribed UGC norms. There are three guest faculty working in the Centre. Services of teachers from other departments, especially the Department of Library & Information Science are sought and provided whenever required.
- 75% attendance is compulsory during the PCPs. In this course, 30% marks are allocated to internal assessment and 70% for the external examinations.

- A candidate who has passed bachelor of Library and information Science examination with at least 50% marks from any recognized University.
- Our curriculum is at par with the one offered through the regular mode of education.
- Attending the Personal Contact Programme (PCP) for M. Lib. I. Sc. (I & II Sem) student is Mandatory.
- Internal Assessment is an essential component of all eight papers. Internal Assessment will be based on Class Attendance during PCP + Submit Response Sheet. On the basis of that every students must be given viva-voce.
- Teachers are accessible in person on all working days. They can also be contacted on phone or through email.

- Library already exists and is rich in Text Books, Research Books and Journals of Economics.
